www.acinet.org – America’s Career Infonet Contains detailed wage information for occupations both national and state data. Also provides information about occupational trends and educational requirements.

www.bls.gov/oco/ - Occupational Outlook Handbook Contains detailed descriptions of over 250 occupations (including wages), covering about 85% of the jobs in the nation.
